Caring for your child after General Anaesthesia (GA)

Going home

Your child must rest for 12 hours once back at home. Soft foods and warm fluids are best to start with.

Don't be concerned if your child vomits once or twice after coming home, but if this continues, contact your family doctor. It is common to experience some mild discomfort following treatment, pain relief medication may be required.

If your child has had teeth extracted:

- Make sure they do not rinse their mouth for 24 hours. This helps healing.
- > A sponge may be placed in the space where the tooth has been removed. This will help control bleeding and usually dissolves within 24 hours.
- > After 24 hours, rinse with half a teaspoon of warm salty water. Continue this after meals and before bed for up to a week.
- > If bleeding continues, place folded gauze over the area and ask your child to bite firmly for 10-30 minutes.
