Hyperparathyroidism

- Primary hyperparathyroidism generally involves some degree of hypercalcaemia with an inappropriately high PTH level (not necessarily above the normal lab range) indicating autonomous PTH production.
 Primary hyperparathyroidism is a clinical and biochemical diagnosis – it is not aided by currently available parathyroid imaging.
- Secondary PTH elevation is most commonly due to vitamin D deficiency, hypocalcaemia or renal failure and involves a normal response of the parathyroid glands to a physiological stimulus it does not indicate any abnormality in the parathyroid glands themselves.

| Red Flags Nausea, vomiting, dehydration, weight loss diminished conscious state Corrected serum calcium >3 mmol/L | or Rapid renal function deterioration Recurrent renal calculi Pancreatitis | |
