

Selling Tobacco?

Don't sell to under 18 year olds

No ID No sale – under 18

By law a tobacco retailer or their employee must ask for proof of age identification if there is any doubt that a purchaser of tobacco is 18 years or older. Always ask to see **photographic identification**. Using the date of birth on the purchaser's **ID** is an easy way to confirm a person's age.

Legal to sell – If purchaser's birthday is on or before **today's date** in this year
