## Things you can do to prevent poisoning:

- Keep medicines and poisons out of reach of children – remember children are great climbers
- Keep medicines and poisons in their original containers with the labels attached
- Close lids tightly immediately after use remember 'child-resistant' does not mean 'child-proof'
- Never leave medicines or poisons unattended, and keep children away when using remember children often copy what they see
- Check in and around your home for medicines and poisons you don't need and safely dispose of them
