Pelvic mesh, also known as 'transvaginal' mesh, has been used in the treatment of pelvic organ prolapse and stress urinary incontinence since the '90s. It is implanted in a surgical procedure via the vagina.

The mesh is a synthetic net-like substance that provides extra support to repair weakened or damaged internal tissue.

Transvaginal mesh products can cause significant and severe complications for some women. However, the majority of women who have had surgical treatment continue to have a good long-term outcome.
