Watto Purrunga Aboriginal Health is committed to providing a free of charge, culturally responsive and comprehensive primary health care service inclusive for all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Communities.

Watto Purrunga consists of Kokotina Tappangga (Clinical Service), Purrunga Waiingga (Wellbeing Service) & Kumangka Padninthi (Aboriginal Hospital Liaison and Emergency Department Access). Together we deliver medical, allied health, family support services and health promotion programs.

Kokotina Tappangga

Kokotina Tappangga operates clinics from four sites and includes Aboriginal Health Practitioners and Aboriginal Health Workers, General Practitioners, GP Registrars, Clinical Nurses and Allied Health services.

Purrunga Waiingga

Purrunga Waiingga provides case management support for social and emotional health issues as well as delivering health promotion programs to the community.

Kumangka Padninthi Health & Wellbeing Unit

Kumangka Padninthi provides support to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander consumers in hospital. The team consists of Aboriginal Hospital Liaison Officers and Aboriginal Health Practitioners who provide support in the Emergency Department to reduce consumers leaving without treatment and patients who discharge against medical advice.

Closed: Saturday, Sunday and Public Holidays.

After Hours Medical Care

Locum services are available weekdays between 4:00pm to 8:00pm and weekends from 12:00pm Saturday to 8:00am Monday. To arrange an afterhours home visit please call 8130 3458.

Transport

Transport is available to Aboriginal clients who meet the eligibility criteria, are registered to our service and require assistance getting to appointments within our service.

Transport must be requested at least 24 hours before the appointment and clients will only be transported to their closest clinic.
