

OUTPATIENT GP REFERRAL GUIDELINES ORTHOPAEDIC FOOT AND ANKLE Southern Adelaide Local Health Network (SALHN)

Ankle / Hindfoot Arthritis

Eligibility

- Pain around the ankle (Ankle, Subtalar, Talonavicular or Calcaneocuboid joint)
- Associated swelling and deformity
- Walking is difficulty especially on uneven ground
- Usually Unilateral
- Usually a history of trauma
- Associated inflammatory arthropathy

Differential Diagnosis

- Tibialis posterior tendon insufficiency
- Fracture around the ankle

Information Required for Referral

- Detail history of the pain(location, severity, type, aggravating and relieving factors)
- Range or movement of the joint
- Associated medical conditions
- Any treatment used (orthotics, brace, analgesia)
- Exact location of the swelling
- Associated deformity

Investigations Required for Referral

- Weight bearing Ankle x rays (AP, Lateral Mortise view and Saltzmann Views)
- Weight bearing Foot x rays (AP, Lateral and oblique view)

Red Flags

- Evidence of infection immediate referral to the **Emergency Department**
- Continuous pain despite the non-operative management- Referral to RGH

Suggested GP Management

- Analgesic +/- anti-inflammatory medication
- Activity modification
- Walking stick/ frame
- Supportive footwear
- Orthotics ankle brace
