A big thanks from me to the Corka Mob for the artwork and letting us use the artwork. We have continued to work in partnership with Pangula Mannamurna. One example of this partnership we were made aware of a gap for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island people receiving eye treatment as some were not able to afford the

gap payment from the Ophthalmologist. We have been able to cover the payment as well as assisting in getting the medication many will receive.

I wish you all well over the Christmas break and hope it is a restful one for you all.

COVID-19 Vaccinations

It is important for us to become vaccinated, to protect our family, Elders and other community members. By doing this, we are also protecting our story tellers, culture and future generation. Getting a vaccine is a safe and effective way of protecting yourself from getting really sick from COVID-19. Encourage your family, Elders and community members to get vaccinated so that they are all protected.



All people over the age of 12 are able to get the Pfizer vaccine from Bordertown Hospital, Naracoorte Hospital, Mount Gambier Vaccination Clinic (at Centro), Millicent Hospital or Kingston Hospital. You will need to book in for your vaccination and can do this by going to <u>www.sahealth.sa.gov.au/regionalclinics</u> Remember from January 12th 2022, 5-11 year olds can now be vaccinated at these clinics also.

Put in your postcode to find the nearest clinic to make an appointment. You are also able to get the Pfizer vaccine at Pangula Mannamurna. Please phone 8724 7270 to make an appointment.
