


# THINGS YOU CAN DO TO PREVENT POISONING

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# THINGS YOU CAN DO TO PREVENT POISONING



**CLOSE LIDS TIGHTLY**, immediately after use.


Remember 'child-resistant'  
doesn't mean 'child-proof'.



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# THINGS YOU CAN DO TO PREVENT POISONING



**NEVER** leave poisons or medicines  
**UNATTENDED.**

And keep children away when  
using them – children often  
copy what they see.



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# THINGS YOU CAN DO TO PREVENT POISONING



**KEEP** poisons in their  
**ORIGINAL CONTAINERS.**

**NEVER DECANT** them into  
other containers.



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# THINGS YOU CAN DO TO PREVENT POISONING



**CHECK** around your home  
to see what **POISONS** you have.

Make sure they are kept safely and  
securely **AWAY FROM CHILDREN.**



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
