ABDOMINAL PAIN	Clinical Presentation/syndrome
Presenting complaint	Abdominal pain
Priority	Variable depends on severity, accompanying symptoms
Information required with referral	 Particular reason for the referral – Abdominal pain is extremely common, so the specific reason for the referral should be stated clearly. History of abdominal pain - site, radiation, severity, character, pattern, precipitating or relieving factors, associated bowel symptoms Duration of abdominal pain – duration since onset of symptoms and also how long pain lasts with each episode (i.e. present for months, pain lasts 1-2 hrs when occurs) Any associated alarm symptoms – weight loss, bleeding, fever, other Past history of Gl disease – cancer, polyps, IBD, coeliac disease, IBS, haemorrhoids, abdominal radiotherapy ? History of Gl disease in first degree relative – IBS, cancer, polyps, IBD Current medication – especially opiates, antidepressants, anticoagulants, antiplatelets, NSAID, SSRI Previous medical assessment or investigation of this pain - If done, please send all relevant information/reports
Investigations required with referral	 All previous tests for this problem (e.g. endoscopic reports, radiology reports, specialist correspondence etc.) CBE, MBA20, CRP or ESR
