All urgent cases must be discussed with the on call registrar.	Target within 4 weeks	Target within 3 months	Target 6-12 months			
<ul> <li>&gt; Diabetic Ketoacidosis</li> <li>&gt; Newly diagnosed type 1 diabetes</li> <li>&gt; Hyperglycaemic hyperosmolar coma</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Type 1 with suboptimal blood glucose control</li> <li>Major of problematic episode(s) of hypoglycaemia</li> <li>Transplant patients with suboptimal blood glucose control</li> <li>High risk pre-operative patients (internal referral)</li> <li>Cystic fibrosis related diabetes with suboptimal blood glucose control</li> <li>Type 1 and type 2 patients who are pregnant</li> <li>Infected foot ulcer*</li> <li>Acute charcot joint*</li> <li>Cancer patients on steroids</li> <li>*these clinics are held by diabetes centre at the RAH and vascular outpatients at TQEH</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Cardiac protocol (STEMI) review</li> <li>Major problematic episode(s) of hypoglycaemia</li> <li>Poorly controlled type 2 diabetes with recent deterioration despite insulin therapy (typically HbA1c &gt; 10%)</li> <li>Non-infected foot ulcer in the patient with diabetes*</li> <li>*these clinics are held by diabetes centre at the RAH and vascular outpatients at TQEH</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Diabetes associated with recent diagnosis of significant micro or macro-vascular complications.</li> <li>Diabetes associated with uncontrolled risk factors of CVD</li> <li>Type 2 with HbA1c &gt;9% on maximal oral therapy and/or symptoms of hyperglycaemia</li> <li>Do not usually need to see a specialist and should be managed by their GP using allied health and diabetes education services utilising a care plan</li> <li>Stable type 2 diabetes</li> <li>Newly diagnosed type 2 diabetes</li> <li>Dietary advice for weight reduction, high cholesterol, hypertension or CVD in diabetic patients</li> </ul>
