

# OUTPATIENT GP REFERRAL GUIDELINES

## ALLERGY/CLINICAL IMMUNOLOGY SERVICE

### Central Adelaide Local Health Network (CALHN)

## Allergic Rhinoconjunctivitis ( Hayfever)

Caused by allergy to environmental substances such as pollens, house dust mite, moulds and animal dander. Symptoms include:

- Nasal congestion/blockage, rhinorrhea/postnasal drip, itch, sneeze
- Itchy, watery eyes, conjunctival injection, swelling

Refer if symptoms severe, inadequate response to standard management, complex respiratory allergic disease

### Information Required

- Duration/impact of symptoms
- Seasonal pattern of symptoms
- Response to a trial of standard management (see below)
- Presence of asthma, sinusitis
- Medical history

### Investigations Required

- Allergen specific IgE to suspected Aeroallergens

### Red Flags

Red flags should prompt urgent GP referral to Ophthalmology



Acute allergic conjunctivitis at risk of corneal involvement

### Suggested GP Management

- Intranasal Corticosteroid
- Use regularly once or twice daily
- Throughout season or all year
- Low systemic absorption preferred- mometasone, fluticasone
- Non-sedating Antihistamines –may use double dose if needed
- Saline nasal spray or irrigation
- Antihistamine nasal spray, eyedrops
- Add Montelukast
