Step 2 Plus of Roadmap to easing COVID-19 restrictions

Step 2 Plus of the South Australian Roadmap for easing COVID-19 restrictions comes into effect today.

The density requirement of 1 person per 4 square metres must still be adhered to. Venues can now have a maximum of 300 people, with a maximum of 75 in each separate room or enclosed area. Private gatherings, funerals and weddings are also limited to 75 people.

Businesses that have already submitted a [COVID-Safe Plan](#) will be emailed an automatic update. It will apply the new capacity numbers using the dimensions of rooms and venues from your original plan.

Further easing of South Australian border restrictions

Currently, travellers entering South Australia directly from Western Australia, Northern Territory and Tasmania are not required to self-quarantine.

From midnight tonight, travellers entering SA directly from Queensland will also not be required to self-quarantine.

Travellers entering from other states and territories are still required to quarantine for 14 days.
