HIV	Clinical Presentation/syndrome
Eligibility	Those with serological evidence of HIV infection Refer to additional Factsheet –" HIV – who to test"
Priority and how to access services	 Urgent referral should be considered if Recent acquisition of virus Acute seroconversion illness Patients previously known to have HIV infection, not on antiretroviral therapy and presenting unwell Pregnancy
	Patients requiring Post Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP) with antiretroviral agents if deemed as high risk - (refer to "HIV - Who to test" factsheet for risk assessment)
	Emergency assistance is available 24 hours a day through the RAH and TQEH Emergency Departments
Information required with referral	 Likely duration of infection Risk factors - IV drug use, sexual orientation and behavioural risk, type of occupational exposure Treatment history – antiretrovirals, STD treatment
Investigations required with referral	 Hep C: Hep C Ab, if +ve, HCV-RNA- qualitative & genotyping Hep B: HBsAb, HBsAg, HBcAb, if Hep B S Ag + HBeAg/HBeAb and delta virus Ab Complete blood count and T cell subsets, LFTs and creatinine Syphilis serology, Urine Chlamydia and Gonococcus PCR, HLA B 57*01, HIV genotype
Pre-Referral management strategies (include with referral)	See additional Factsheet "HIV-Giving a positive result"
