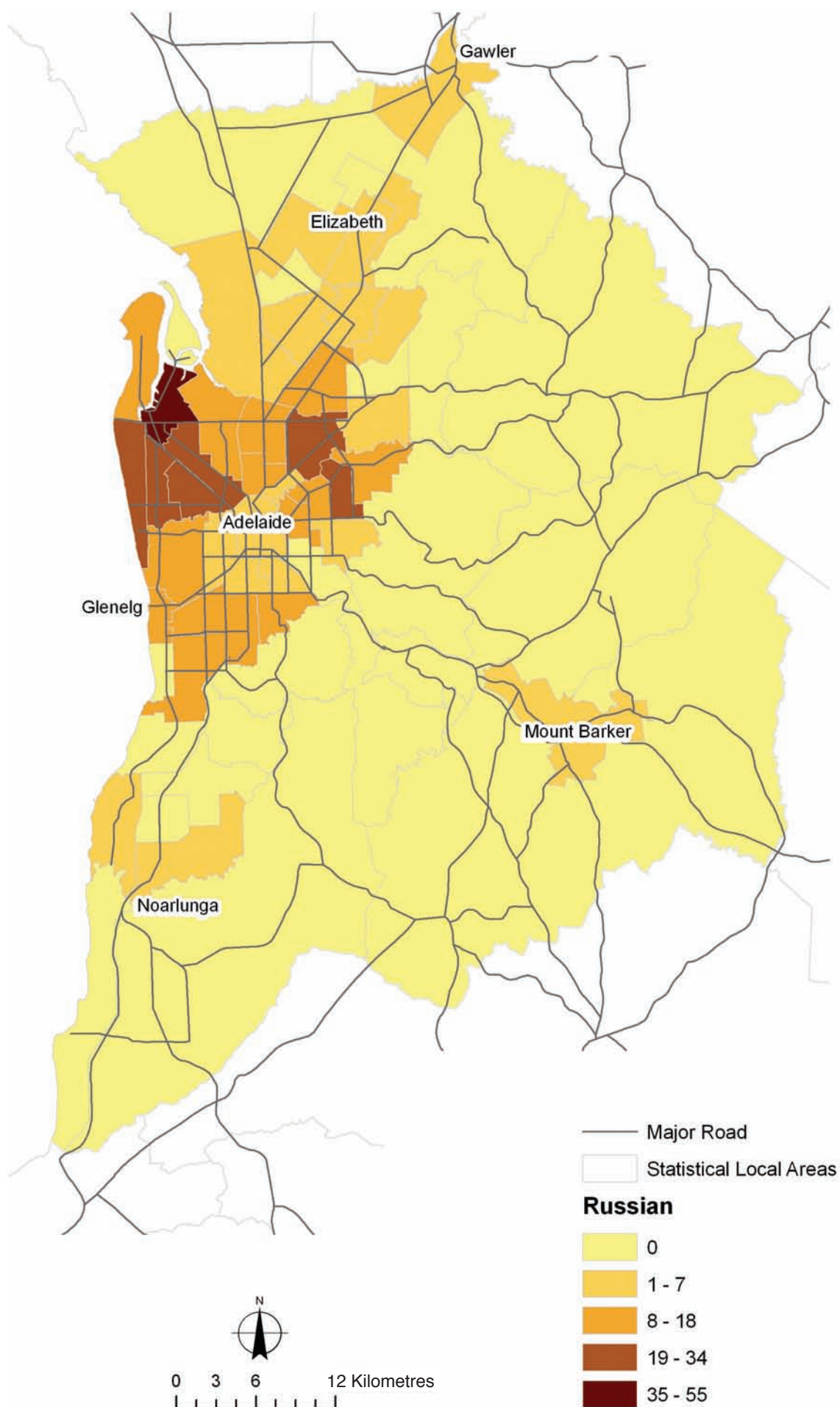


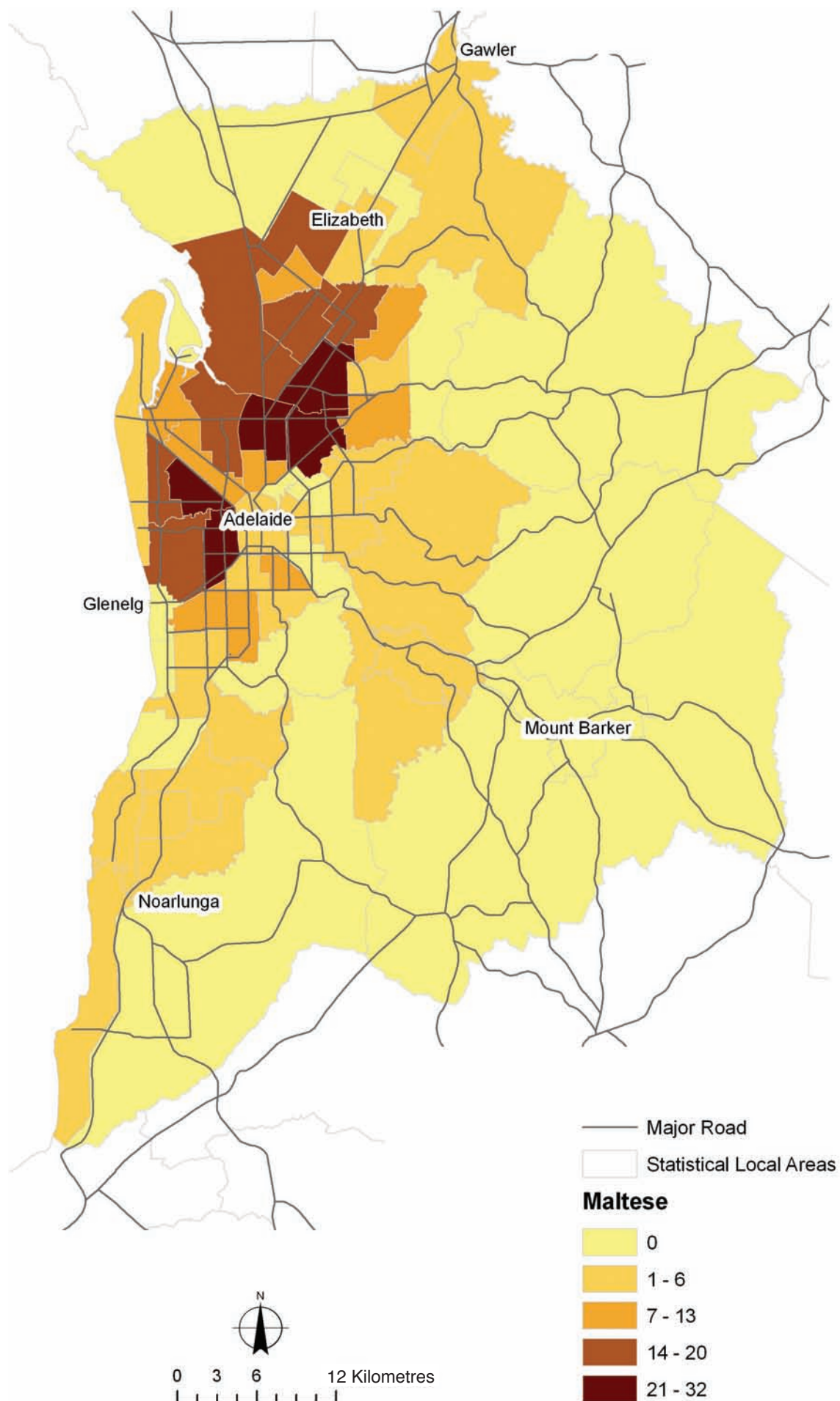
## Language Spoken at Home: Russian

Metropolitan Adelaide and Adelaide Hills



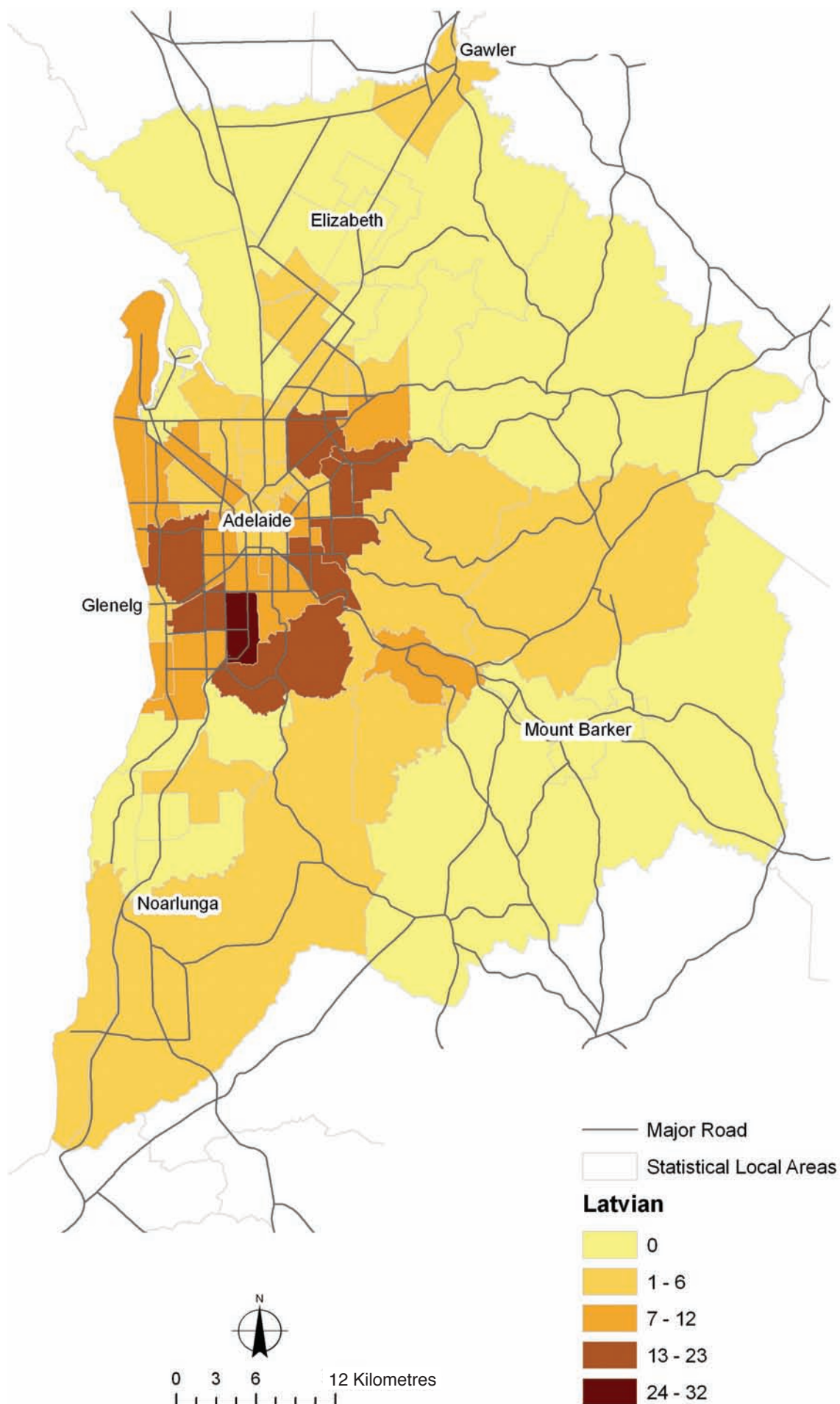
## Language Spoken at Home: Maltese

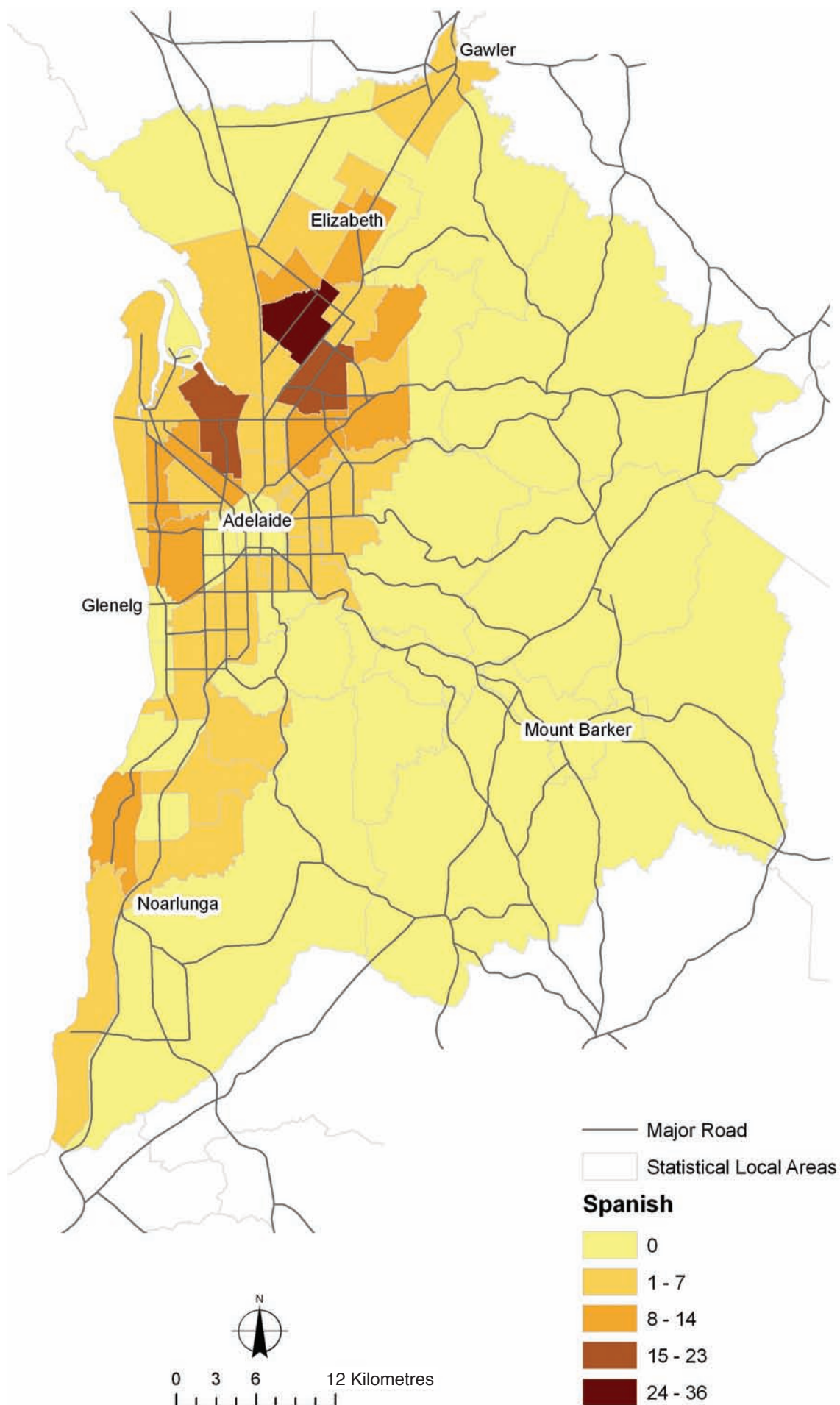

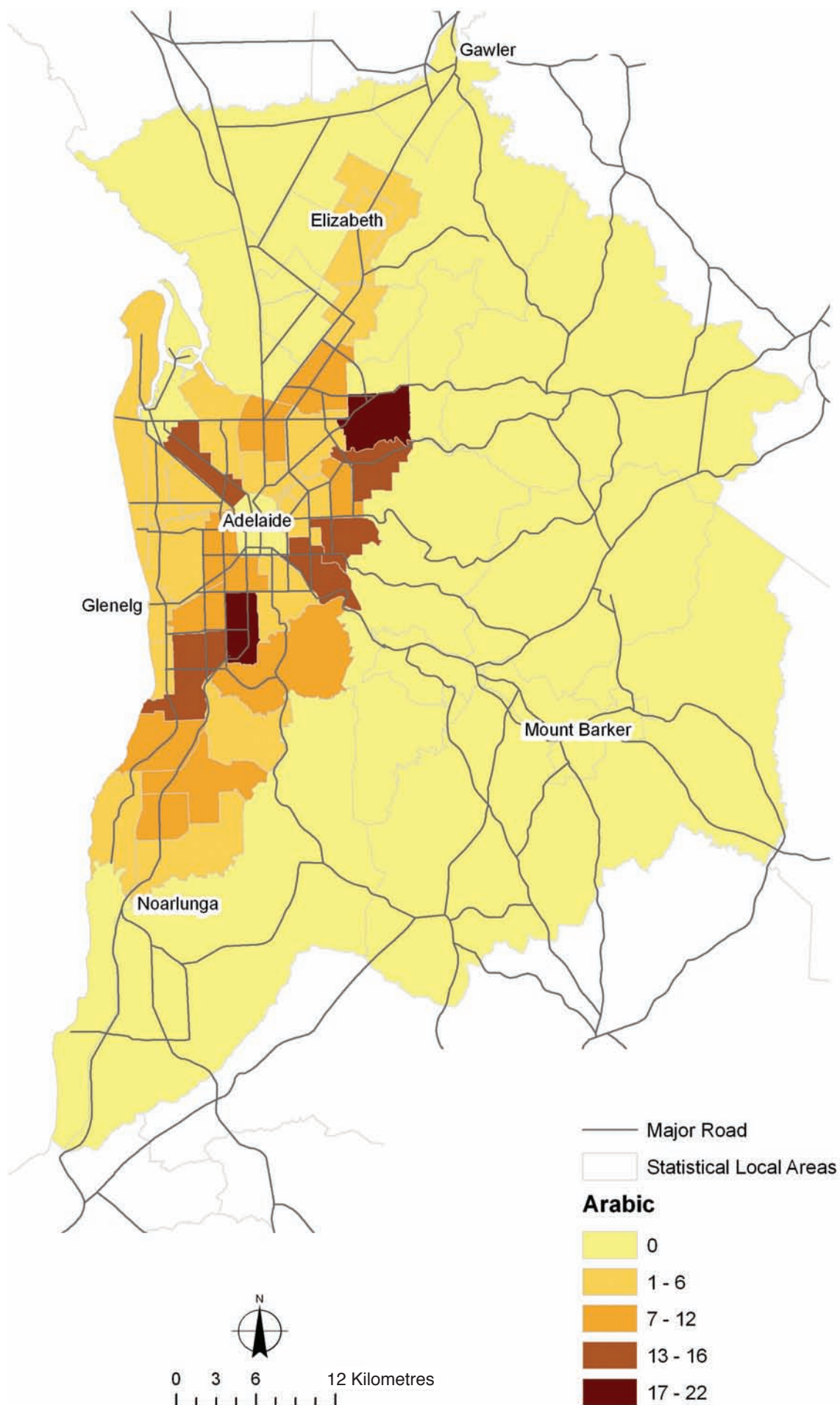
## Language Spoken at Home: Spanish

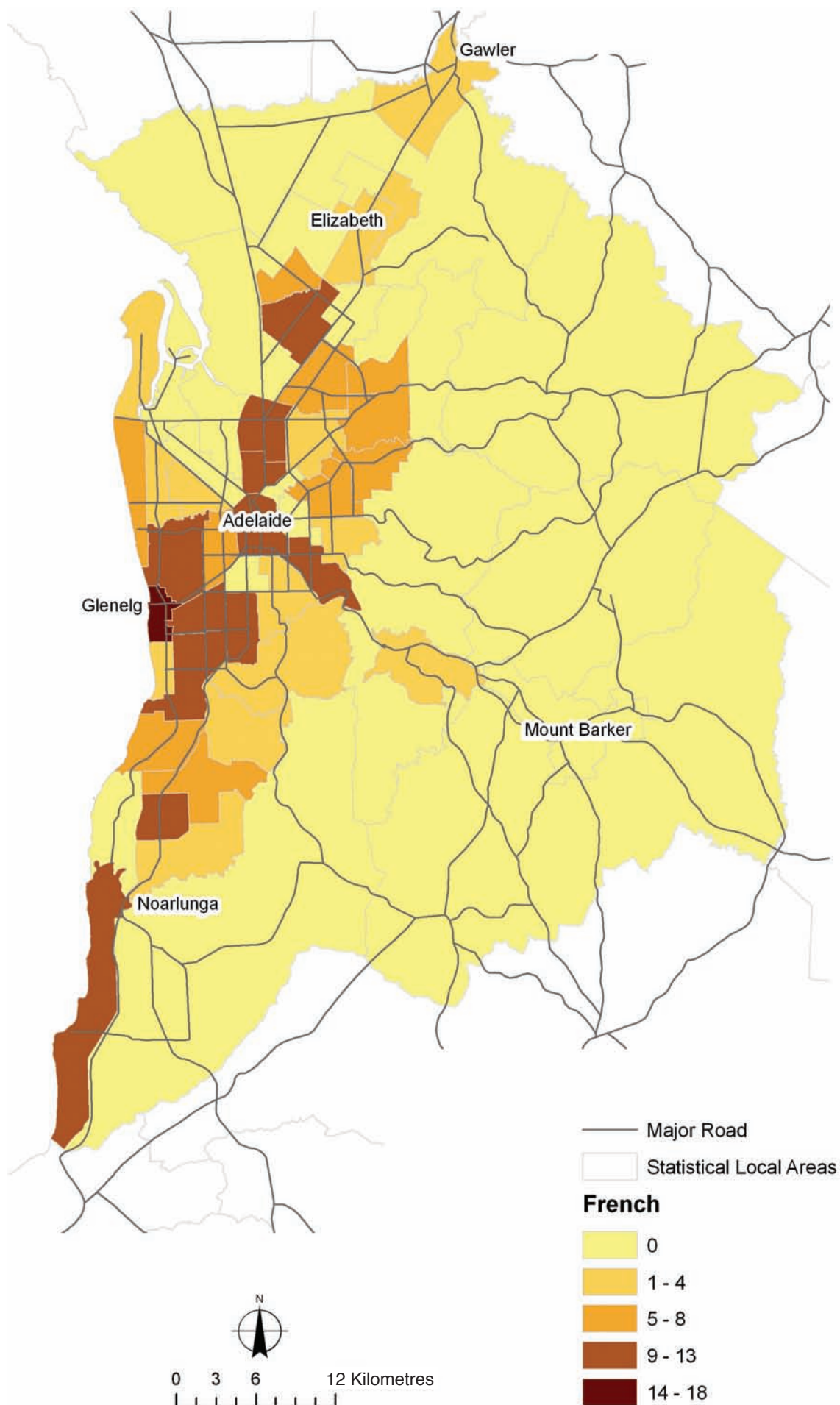

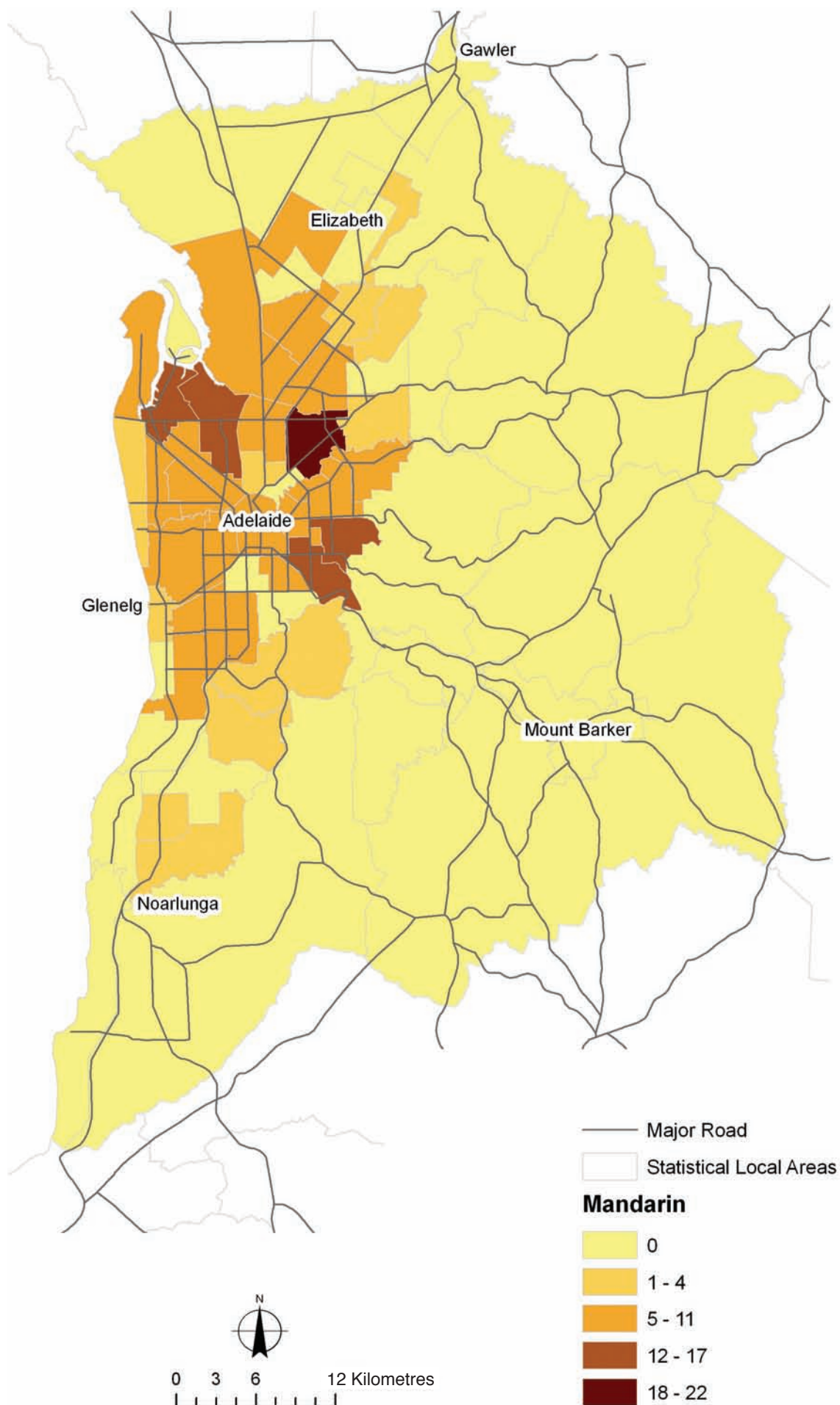

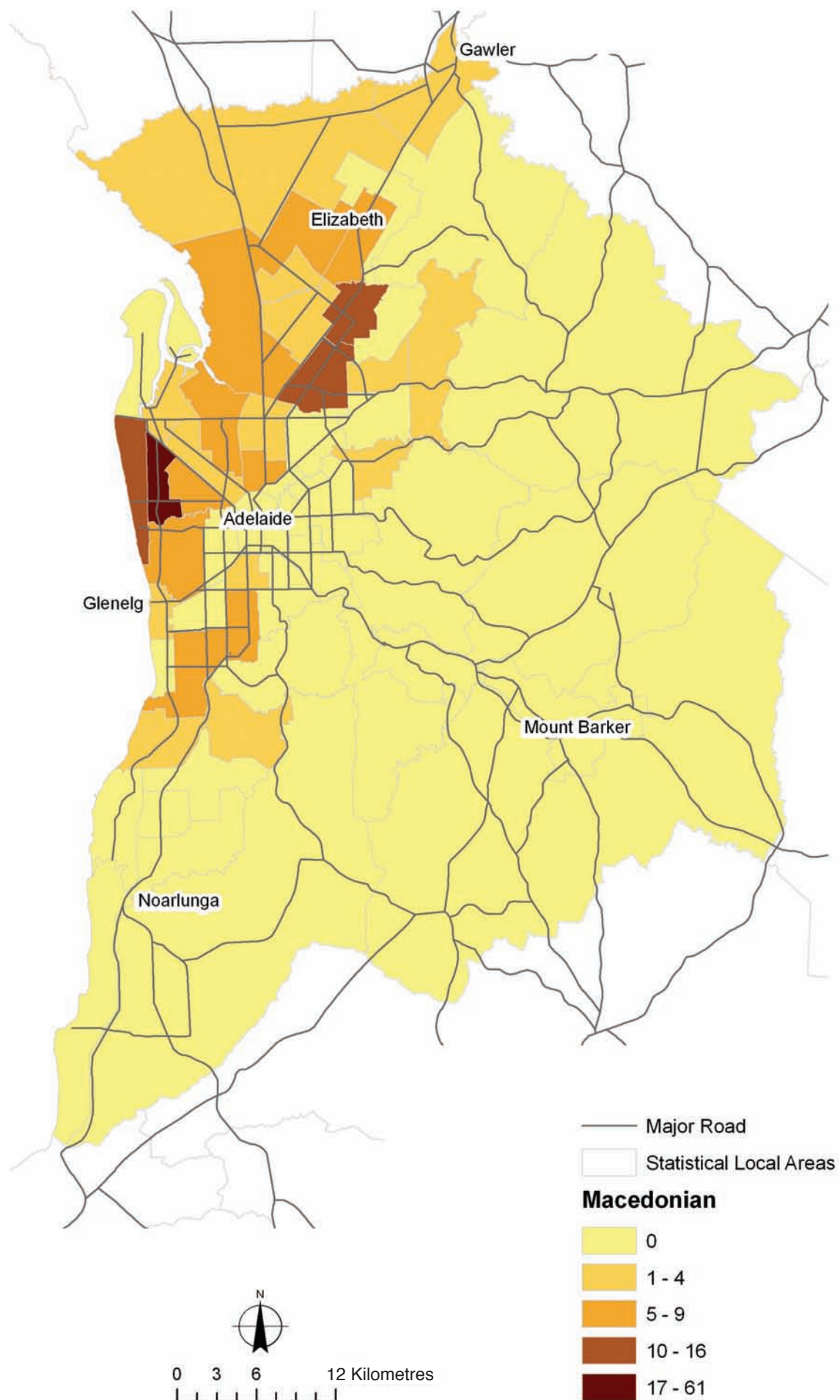

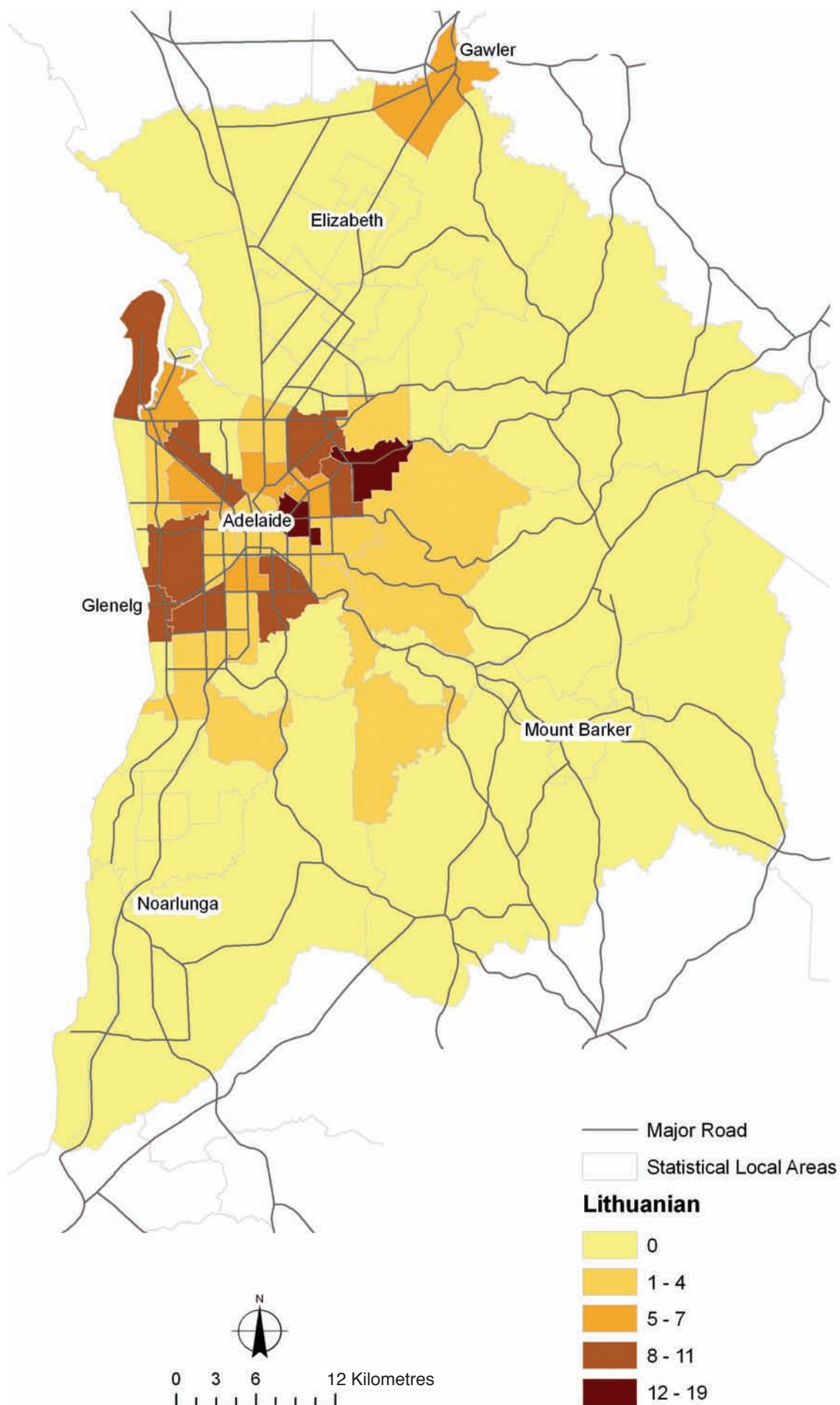

## 4. Religious Affiliation

### 4.1 Largest Populations by Religious Affiliation – People of All Ages

As shown in Table 9, the most common religious affiliations for South Australians of all ages were Christian, with Western Catholic as the largest followed by the Anglican Church of Australia.

The data for the total South Australian population shows that the largest single 'religious affiliation' group were people who identified as having 'no religion' (361,861 people). It is also evident that a large number of people (181,553) chose not to state their religious affiliation.

In 2006, Buddhism was the largest non Christian religious affiliation across all age groups in South Australia. Islam was the 12th largest (10,518 people), Hinduism 19th (5,116 people) and Sikhism the 34th largest (1,225 people).

### 4.2 Religious Affiliations of Older People Aged 65 Years and Over

As shown in Table 10, the majority of older South Australians aged 65 years and over were affiliated with the Anglican Church of Australia, Western Catholicism or the Uniting Church.

Older people not stating their religious affiliation were the fourth largest group (23,408 people) and older people with no stated religion ranked as the fifth largest group.

There were also significant numbers of older people whose religious affiliation was Lutheran (12,694 people) or Greek Orthodox (6,986 people).

According to the Census, the three largest non Christian religious affiliations amongst older people were Buddhism (13th largest, 1,214 people), Islam (23rd largest, 305 people) and Judaism (28th largest, 201 people).

Fewer older people were affiliated to Sikhism compared to younger age groups. For South Australians of all ages, Sikhism was the 34th largest single affiliation, however amongst older people aged 65 years and over, Sikhism was not one of the largest 40 religious affiliations.

### 4.3 Religious Affiliations of Older People Aged 80 Years and Over

The largest single religious affiliation for older South Australians aged 80 years and over, was the Anglican Church of Australia. This was followed by the Uniting Church (second largest) and Western Catholicism (third largest).

Older people aged 80 years and over not stating their religious affiliation were the fourth largest group (7,470 people) and those with no stated religion the fifth largest (5,306 people).

Within this age group Buddhism was the 14th largest religious affiliation (272 people). The number of older people age 80 years and over affiliated to Judaism or Islam was less than 80 people in 2006.

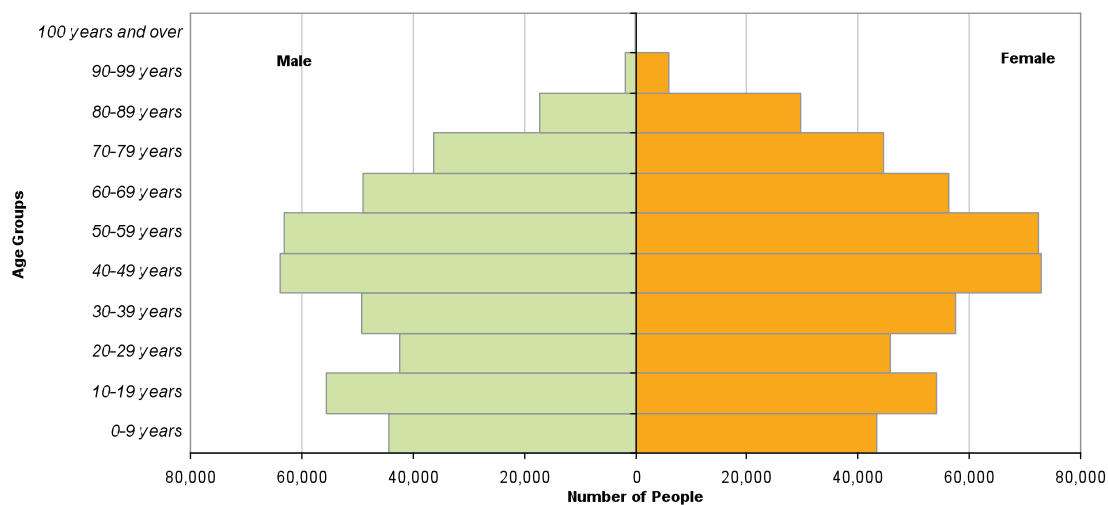

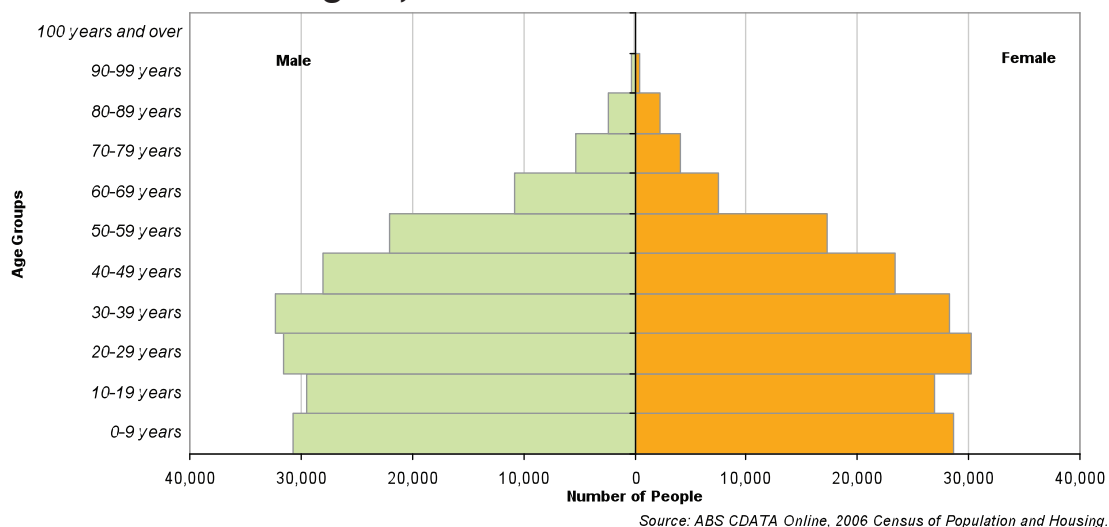

## 4.4 Number of Males and Females for Each 10 Year Age Group – Selected Religious Affiliations

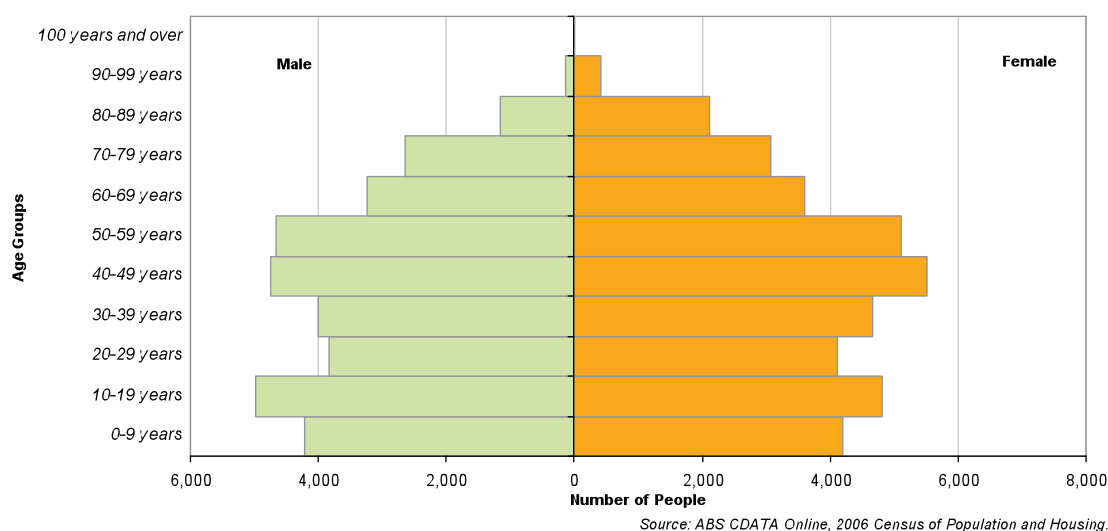

## Religious Affiliation: Greek Orthodox

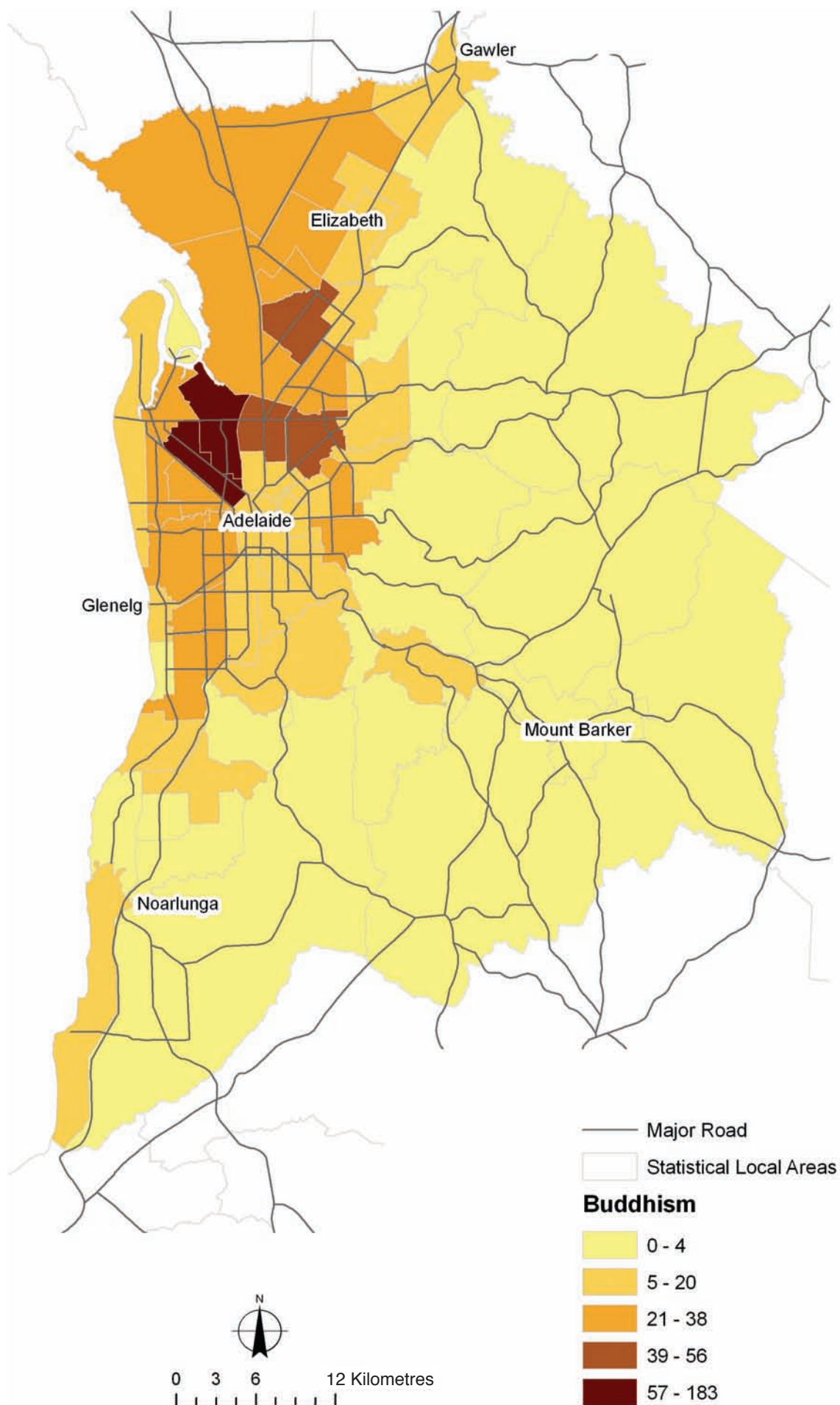

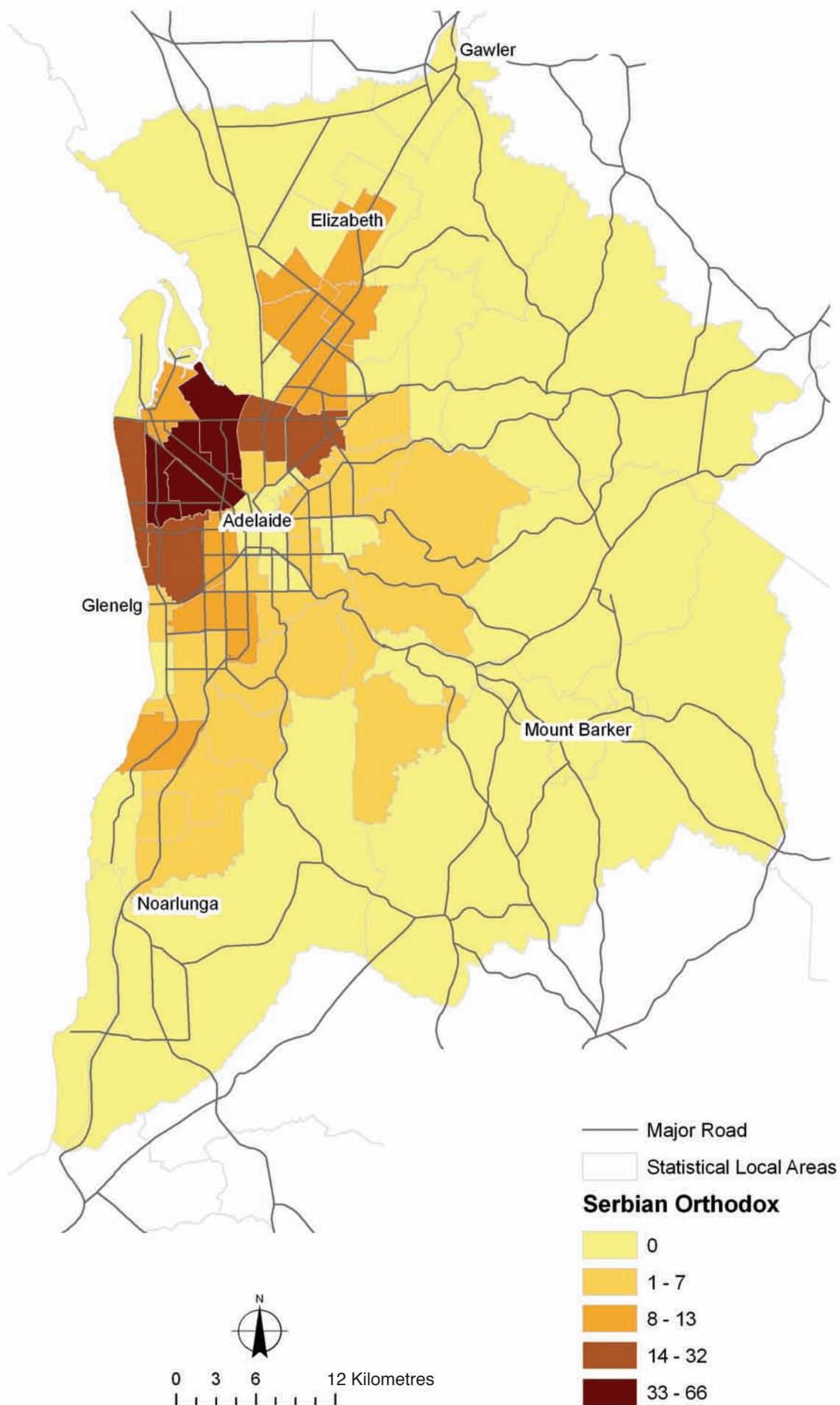
## Religious Affiliation: Buddhism

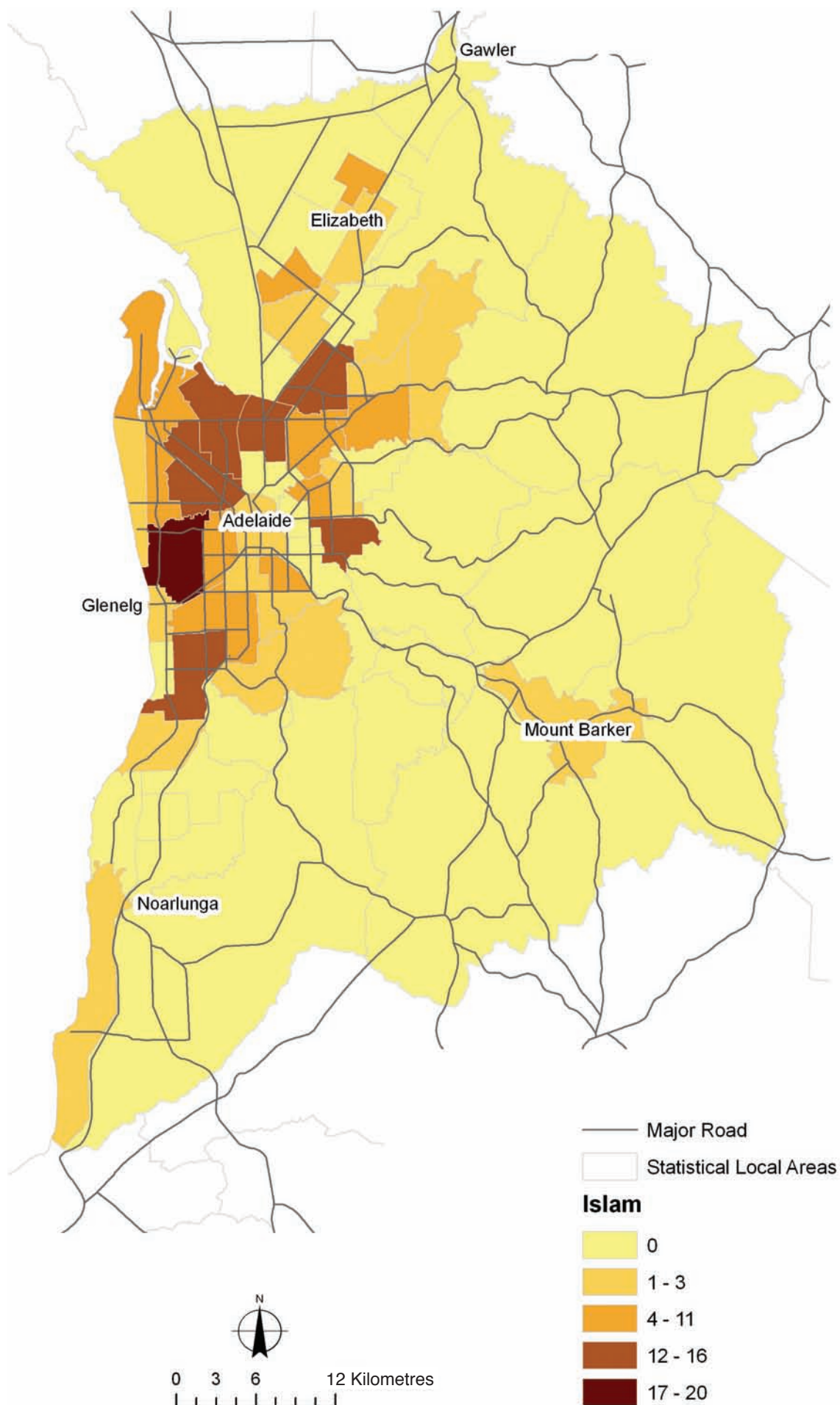
## Religious Affiliation: Serbian Orthodox

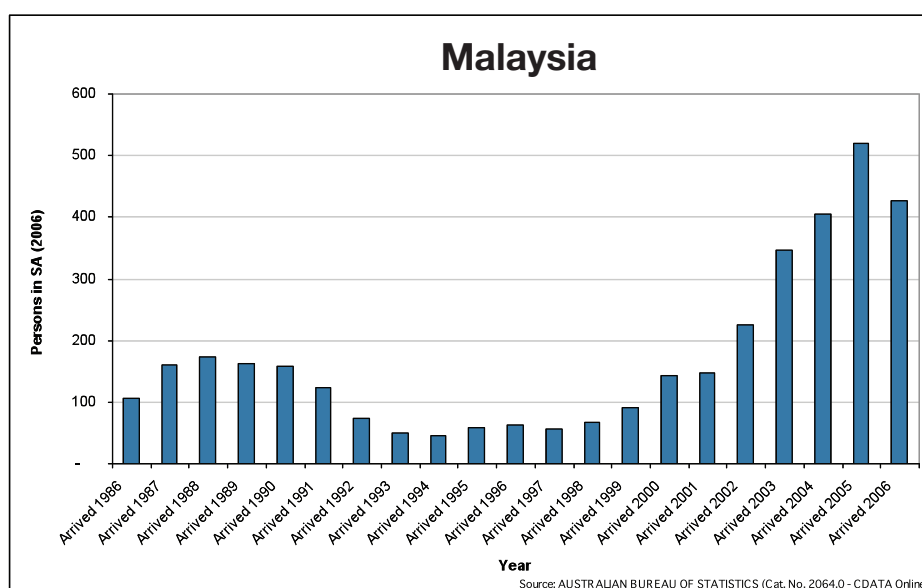
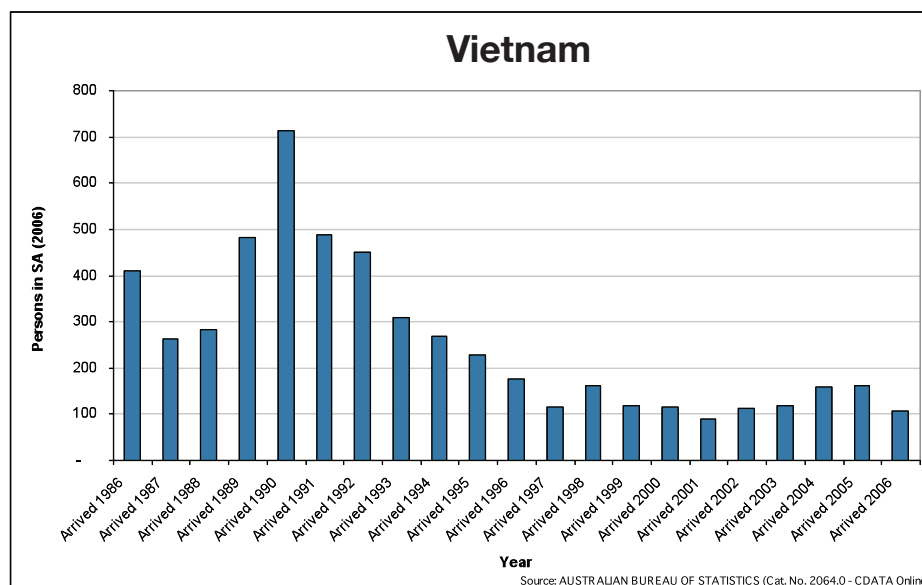
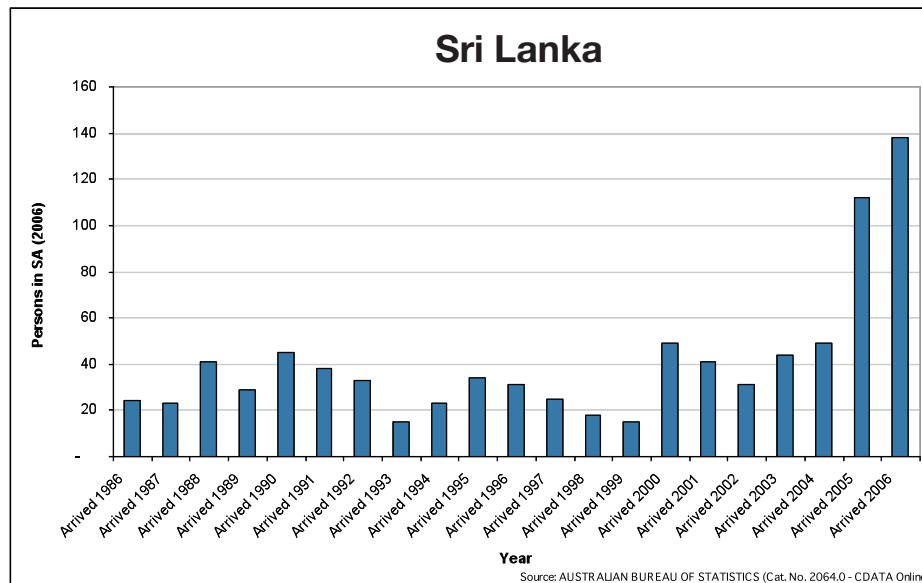


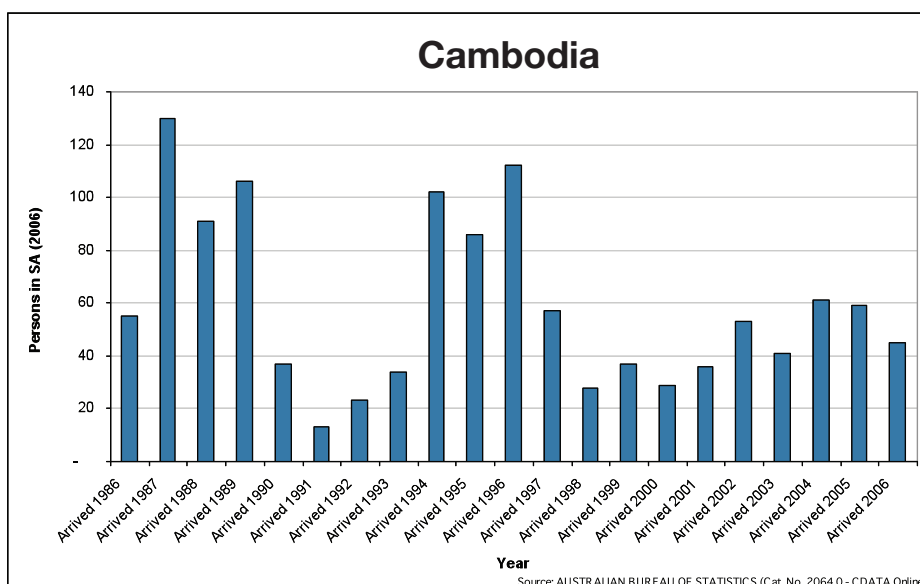
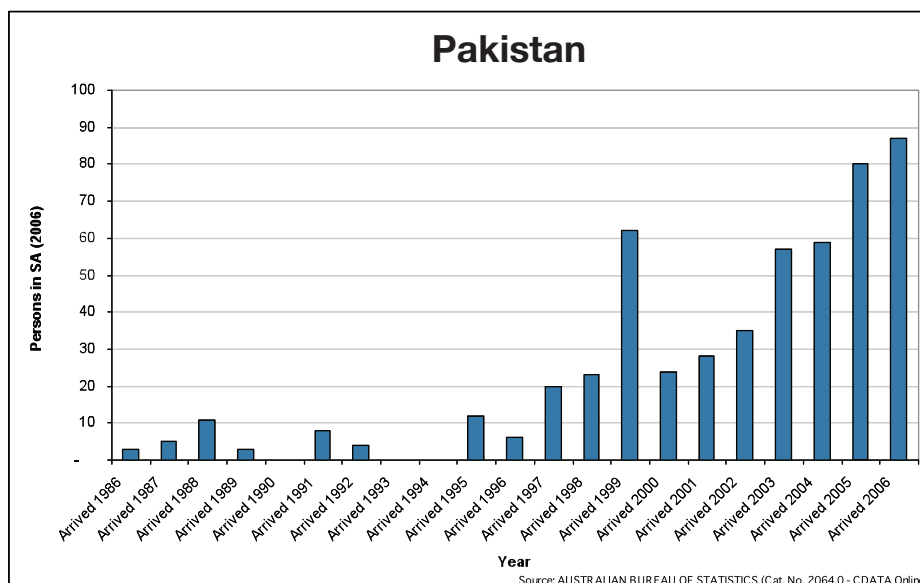
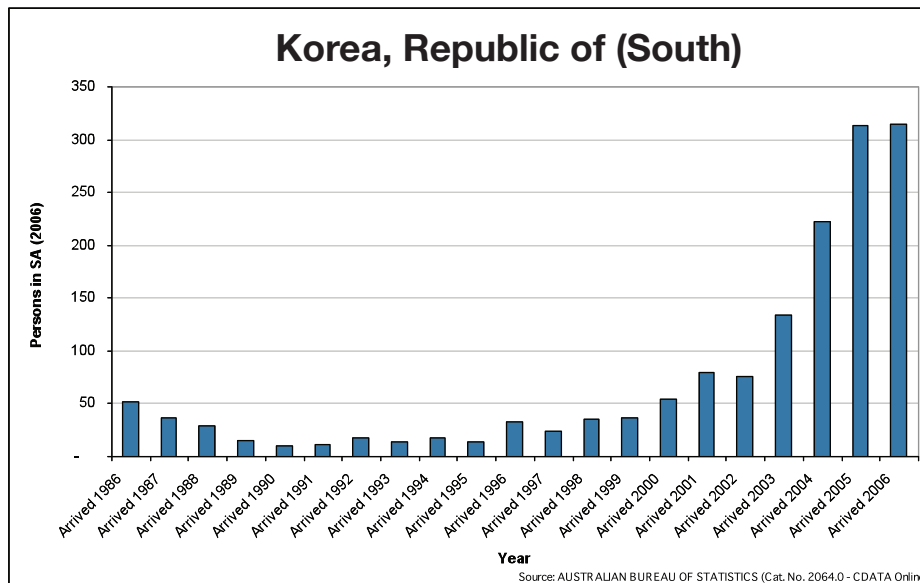
## 5. Number of People from Selected Countries of Birth by Year of Arrival in Australia 1986 - 2006

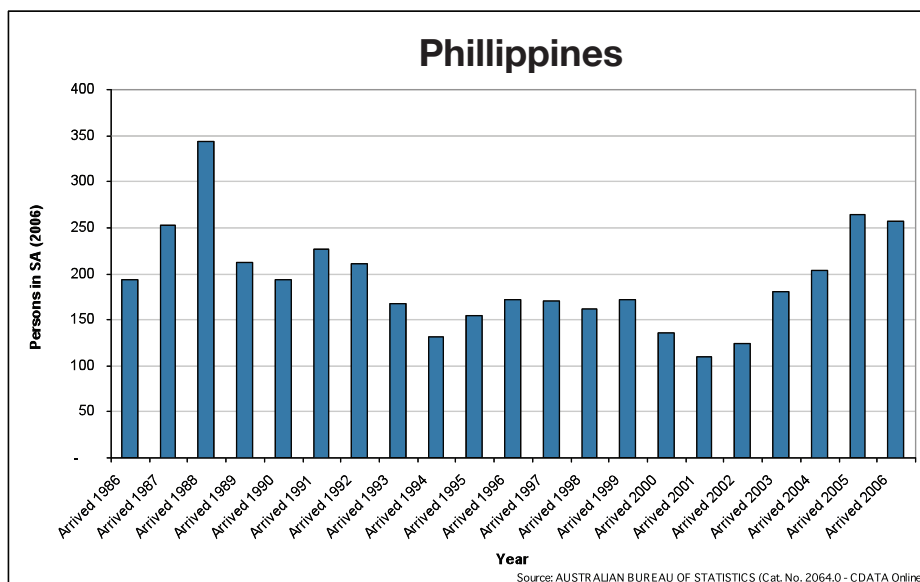
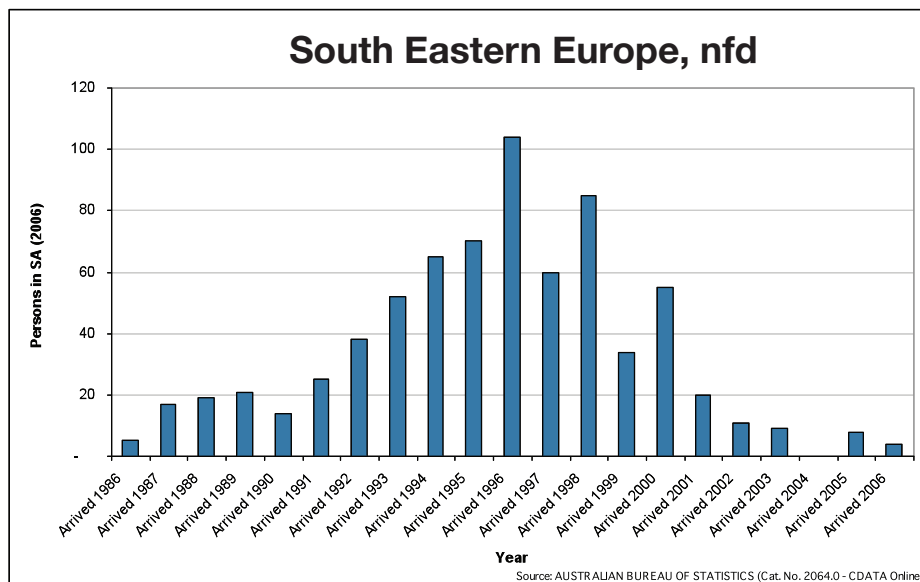
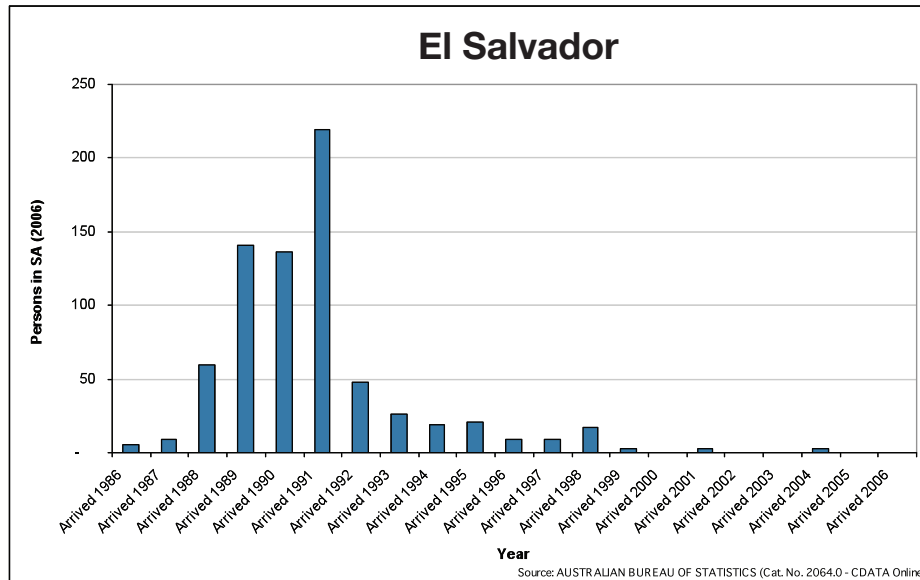












## 6. Data Sources and Notes

### Data Sources

Data presented are from the Australian Bureau of Statistics 2006 Census of Population and Housing, CData Online.

Data may include non permanent residents for example overseas students.

### Naming of Data Categories

The naming of countries, languages and religious affiliations used in this report, and the grouping of countries, follows the Australian Bureau of Statistics standards and classifications as supplied by the Australian Bureau of Statistics CData Online 2006 product.

### ‘Not Further Defined’

A ‘not further defined’ classification is used by the Australian Bureau of Statistics to process incomplete, non specific or imprecise responses in the Census. These responses cannot be coded to the most detailed level of a classification (for example an individual country or language group), but contain enough information to allow them to be coded to a higher level of the classification structure (for example a regional group).

### People Born Overseas in Mainly Non English Speaking Countries

People born overseas in mainly Non English Speaking Countries includes all countries of birth except for Australia, New Zealand, United Kingdom, Ireland, Canada, United States of America and South Africa.

### People Living in Non Metropolitan South Australia

The calculations of the proportions of people who live in non metropolitan South Australia do not include people in off-shore areas and migratory or people with no usual address.

### Proficiency in Spoken English

The calculations of the proportions of people who do not speak English well or at all (‘Little or No English’) do not include people in the non stated or not applicable categories.

### Spatial Maps

The spatial maps included in this report were compiled by Office for the Ageing in July / August 2009 using ABS CData Online data.

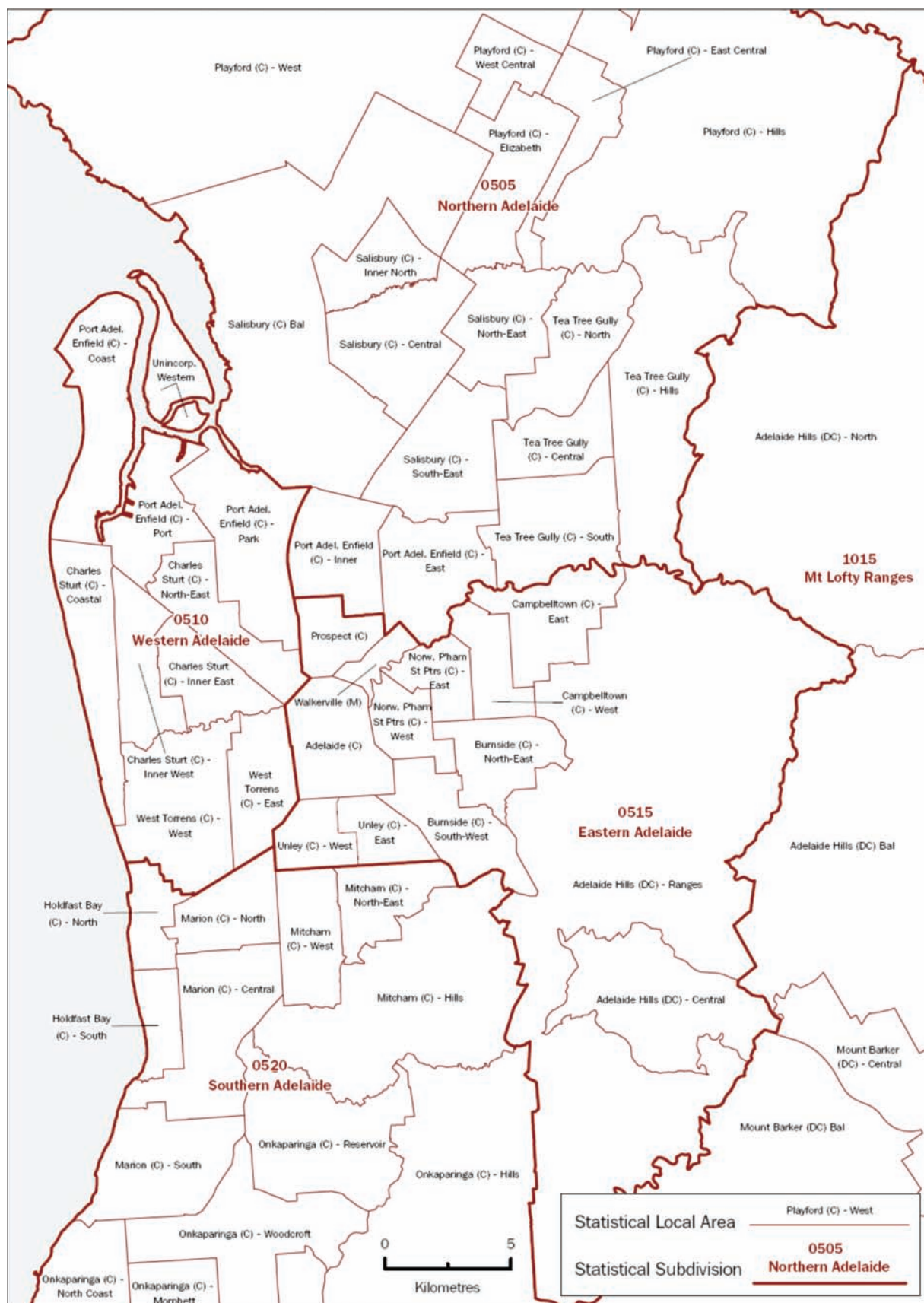

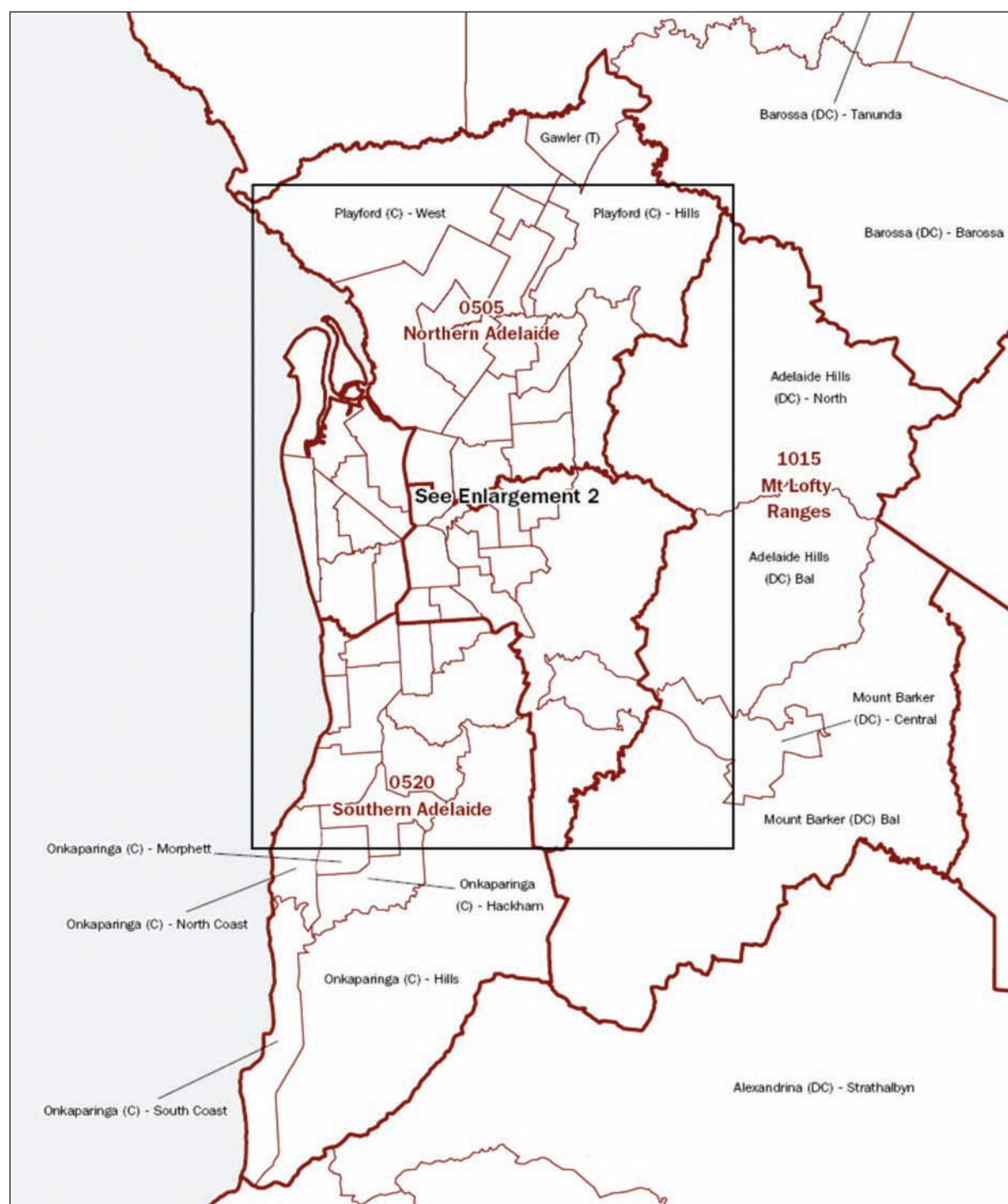
