

Public outdoor dining areas are SMOKE-FREE from 1 July 2016









## From 1 July 2016:

Public outdoor dining areas are smoke-free.

This means smoking is banned in outdoor dining areas at all times that food is being offered or provided. This includes, for example, outdoor dining areas at pubs, clubs, restaurants, cafes and at temporary events.

An outdoor dining area is an unenclosed public area in which tables, or tables and chairs, are provided for the purpose of public dining in the area.

Snack food is not included in the ban. For the purposes of this law, snack food is any pre-packaged food of a kind generally intended to be consumed between meals, e.g. potato crisps, nuts, chocolate bars and pre-packaged biscuits.

Smoke-free outdoor dining areas protect you from harmful second hand smoke.

- If you smoke in an outdoor dining area, you could be fined \$75 (maximum penalty \$200).
- The business owner/proprietor could be fined \$160 (maximum penalty \$1,250).
