
THINGS YOU CAN DO TO PREVENT POISONING IN AND AROUND THE HOME

Never leave poisons or medicines unattended.

And keep children away when using them – children often copy what they see.

medicines (paracetamol, ibuprofen, iron tablets, contraceptive pills, anti-depressants, cough & cold medicines), chest rubs, vaporiser fluids, hand sanitiser, mouthwash, shampoo, perfume, nail polish remover CLOSE lids tightly, immediately after use. Remember 'child-resistant' doesn't mean 'child-proof'.

laundry liquid, bleach, shower cleaner, eucalyptus oil

containers.

Never decant them into other containers.

dishwashing tablets, powders and liquids, oven cleaner, fly spray, mothballs, cockroach baits
