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## **Overview:** about the agency

#### Our strategic focus

The Northern Adelaide Local Health Network Health Advisory Council Inc (also referred to as the Governing Council) was established by the then South Australian Minister for Health and Ageing to undertake an advocacy role on behalf of the community, and to provide advice to the Minister for Health and Wellbeing and the Northern Adelaide Local Health Network (NALHN) in relation to health matters, among other functions. In accordance with the requirements of Section 17 of the Health Care Act 2008 the Governing Council has been governed by a Constitution determined bv the Minister. The Constitution is available at http://www.sahealth.sa.gov.au/nalhn.

#### Our organisational structure

The Governing Council undertakes an advocacy role on behalf of the north and north-eastern Adelaide community, and provides advice in relation to health matters and other functions to the Minister and NALHN. NALHN provides administrative support to ensure the proper functioning of the Governing Council.

The Governing Council comprises of no fewer than six and not more than eight Members, including a Presiding Member. When making appoints to the Governing Council, the Minister has regard for the need to ensure the membership has an appropriate mix of skills and expertise required to oversee and provide guidance to NALHN.
