

OUTPATIENT REFERRAL GUIDELINES

Heart Failure with Reduced Ejection Fraction Clinic Southern Adelaide Local Health Network (SALHN)

Service Overview

- This outpatient clinic provides rapid assessment for outpatients with newly diagnosed Heart Failure with reduced Ejection Fraction (HFrEF).
- Referrals will be accepted from General Practitioners (GP) or other physicians, by way of the HFrEF referral form.
- The clinic will liaise with a patient's referring GP / physician following initial consultation.

Inclusion Criteria

- New diagnosis of heart failure
- Ejection fraction ≤ 40%

Exclusion Criteria

- Patient known to a Cardiologist (i.e. has seen another Cardiologist in Adelaide within the last two years as an outpatient [private or public]). These patients should be referred back to their existing Cardiologist
- Age >80
- Requiring residential care (nursing home)
- Cognitive degenerative disease (i.e. dementing illness)
- Life expectancy <1 year due to non-cardiac illness or known to palliative care
- End stage renal failure (dialysis)
- End stage chronic lung disease (0₂ dependent)

Investigations Required (please provide results with referral)

In the past 12 months:

- Echocardiogram
- Electrocardiogram
- Chest X-Ray
- Blood work (CBP, ECU, NT proBNP, TFT, LFT)
- Medications list (generic named drugs and dosages)
