Midwifery

Registered midwives have the knowledge and the skills to work with women during pre-conception, pregnancy, labour, birth, and to provide care for the mother and baby. Additionally they may work in the areas of sexual and reproductive health.

The Bachelor of Midwifery can be studied either as an undergraduate degree (some may have done other degrees first), or post registration/professional entry. The first undergraduate degree program is studied full time over three years and the post registration/professional entry degree program is studied full time over eighteen months (or the equivalent part time).

Upon successful completion of a Bachelor of Midwifery course, the graduate will have reached the required competency levels to be eligible to apply for entry onto the midwifery register.
