

Allied Health Rural Generalist Pathway

Evaluation of 2019/2020 cohort

In 2019 with Rural Health Workforce Strategy funding, SA Health introduced the Allied Health Rural Generalist Pathway as a workforce strategy for allied health professionals. Trainees completed rural generalist training through James Cook University and contributed to local service development projects.


