Clinical Condition	Suspected TB exposure or Immune suppressive risk in asymptomatic patients
Eligibility	 Suspected TB contact Immune suppressed patient for assessment of TB risk Proposed immune suppressive treatment (eg TNF-α inhibitors) New arrivals from high TB prevalence countries Abnormal CXR suggestive of past TB infection
Priority	Immediate priority, urgent or semi-urgent: • Immune suppressed patient with suspected history of recent TB exposure. •
Differential Diagnoses	TB infection (no disease) Inactive TB disease
Information required with referral	History: • Known TB contact • HIV status or other immunosuppression • Immigration status – eg recent arrivals from endemic areas. • Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) status • Other co-morbidities and medications • Health care worker Other medical and allied health practitioners the patient has seen concerning this problem.
Investigations required with referral	Quantiferon TB Gold Assay (optional) Any previous/current radiology
Pre-Referral management strategies (include with referral)	Nil specific
