Speech Pathology

Outpatient service information, triage and referral guidelines

Description of Service:

The Speech Pathology department in Central Adelaide Local health Network (CALHN) is a specialist unit focusing on providing comprehensive assessment and management of a wide range of swallowing and communication impairments.

Services Provided:

- Pre and post head & neck surgical education and management of communication and swallowing (including laryngectomy, mouth and throat related cancers)
- > Assessment and management of voice-related disorders
- Joint ENT specialist/speech pathologist assessment and review of the larynx and voice at 'The Adelaide Voice Clinic' including laryngeal tumour surveillance
- Assessment of complex swallowing disorders via fibreoptic-endoscopic evaluation of swallowing (FEES) or joint radiology/speech pathology modified barium swallow study (DF Speech Pathology Swallow)

Exclusions:

- Paediatric related speech/language/swallowing disorders
- Adult speech and language difficulties (including articulation, stuttering, literacy difficulties, dyslexia, English as a second language).
- Ongoing rehabilitation and/or management or communication and swallowing difficulties related to neurological and neurodegenerative conditions including Parkinson's disease, multiple sclerosis, stroke, traumatic brain injury, spinal cord injury, motor neurone disease or congenital conditions
- Return to work/industrial rehabilitation/work cover/motor accident claims or any compensable condition.
