		<ul> <li>Central pharmacy service for South Australia noting that the patient receives medication in a locked box and they may or may not disclose they are in possession of this.</li> <li>The majority of patients will self administer with practitioner only able to administer if patient is unable to self administer.</li> <li>Eligibility criteria for patients is significant.</li> <li>Patients may be frustrated about the number of times documentation and assessments are repeated but this is part of the safeguarding process to ensure the patient has the capacity to understand what they are seeking.</li> <li>Public hospitals are required to participate although individual health practitioners have a right to refuse to participate.</li> <li>Health practitioners are prohibited from initiating discussion about VAD but may provide information if requested.</li> <li>Mandatory training requirements for health practitioners.</li> </ul>
