Outpatient services include comprehensive care for patients with haematological malignancies complex coagulation/thrombosis disorders and general haematology. Outpatient services are offered across Flinders Medical Centre (FMC) and the Repatriation General Hospital (RGH)

- Lymphoma
- Multiple Myeloma
- Chronic Lymphocytic Leukaemia (CLL)
- Complex Coagulation Disorders
- Neutropenia
- Anaemia
- Thrombocytopenia
- Myelodysplastic Syndrome (MDS)
- Idiopathic Thrombocytopenic Purpura (ITP)
- Myeloproliferative Neoplasms (MPN)
- Monoclonal Gammopathy of Unknown Significance (MGUS)

Services not provided for

- Simple Iron Deficiency Anaemia (exclude Gastroenterology/Gynaecological cause prior to review)
- Non-complicated DVT / PE
