
From the Presiding Members

The 2018-2019 year has been a challenge on a number of levels within the Northern and Yorke Region. With myself as the new presiding member, I thank Doug Reed for the massive contribution he has made over many years as Presiding member. I also thank Doug for continuing on as a community member, in a supporting role to myself, as his knowledge and historical experience within the Northern Yorke Peninsula Health Advisory Council (NYHAC) has been of incredible help to the group.

The NYPHAC have been involved in many discussions around the Medical Practitioner issues faced by the Wallaroo Hospital, and have had interactions with the Director of Nursing, Local/State/Federal Members of government. We have provided support to the hospital in conveying information to the public and returning feedback to the system.

The Locum Model currently operating is far from ideal, but is providing a level of functionality to the hospital. Discussions with the Minister for Health and Wellbeing are still continuing around this for a long term solution, which will assist in the improved functionality of the Wallaroo Private Hospital which co-exists at the Wallaroo site.

As a HAC we have worked through a member, Luke Halls to further develop and enhance the website for the NYPHAC which we are proud of and use it in conjunction with a Facebook page, to increase mobility of information being conveyed to the community. Well Done Luke!



As Presiding Member I have been involved in the Steering Group Committee, completing the initial work from Doug Reed. The template for the future has been instrumental in supporting discussions with the Minister for Health and Wellbeing and allowing the health service as a whole plan and direct the next phase of health services in the region.

This is now being used as a template for other health services throughout the region and elsewhere in the state to look at 'what they have, what they don't and how can we best provide services to fill the gap"

The Presiding Member Panel meeting have been great for myself starting fresh in the role, and sadly they have been suspended in the short term until clarity around roles and responsibilities under the new health system in South Australia. Under the new local health networks we will be able to continue this on a local scale through meetings organised through the new Yorke and Northern Local Health Network Governing Board.

I must take this opportunity to thank Vanessa Boully (Chair of the Governing Board), for her communication and overall inclusion of the HAC's within her control. We have been kept informed, and had regular meetings to communicate the changes as they become clear and allowed the NYPHAC to understand its role initially and how we can assist the governing board going forward.
